Raptor Security System

We have a visitor management system known as *Raptor*. If you have school-aged children, you are more than likely familiar with this system. Used by more than 5,300 (40%) U.S. school districts, this technology has become a quick and easy way to assist staff in recognizing who should or should not be on campus, in a building, or around children.

September 1, when coming to the campus Monday – Friday, 9-3:30 pm, you will use the main office doors and let the staff know you are here. If you are to enter the preschool building anytime during preschool hours, Monday – Friday, 9-1pm, you must have a badge issued to you by the main office or the preschool office and conspicuously wear it. If you are on the cooking team or any other group that accesses the big kitchen, you must come to the church office, check-in, and wear your printed badge. Please, do not enter any side

A Letter from your Director of Community and Education Rev. Dr. Chris Murphy

Steele Creek! As of last Sunday, I've been in this congregation for four months. The hospitality shown towards my family has made it easy to slip right in. I've greatly enjoyed getting to know many of you and look forward to getting to know many more. Over the past few months, I've been watching, visiting, and generally attempting to gain a sense of the ministries happening here in Steele Creek. Along the way, I've had conversations that typically go something like, "You're the new Director of Community Formation. Great! What does that mean, exactly?"

That makes sense. The word "community" has become notoriously slippery. I talk to individuals all the time who search but find it elusive. What's more, when pressed to be specific about what they're looking for, many offer a stuttered "You know? Community. Like, being community and stuff. Do I really need to explain this?"

The deeply embedded desire for community is universal, even when we lack the language to describe what we want precisely. We yearn for it. Our neighbors yearn for it. We are relational critters through and through, longing to connect to something bigger than ourselves. (continued next page)

door to bypass this check-in. If you are not entering the preschool building but on campus, please always drop by and check-in at the main office; you do not have to have a printed badge, but we would love to say hello and know that you are on campus.

This system requires a driver's license or state issued I.D. card. You will present your I.D. during your first check-in. Your image, name, and date of birth are collected from the scanner. A search is completed on publicly found offender databases. The Raptor system does not collect social security numbers nor does it store your data in a Raptor owned database. All data is contained in-house. This system will not be used on weekends or in the evenings.

This system is in place on our campus for everyone's safety - especially to protect the preschool's children. This visitor management system will allow the church staff, preschool staff and teachers to know if someone is on the campus, and if they should or should not be in certain areas. Thank you for your support and faith in allowing the two staffs to work together creating a safer environment for all who work here and attend school here.

When I use the word community, I'm referring to the "container" in which this longing is practiced and fulfilled.

It's how we choose to gather: through small groups, bible studies, retreats, significant events, and the like. My role here is to help facilitate the "container."

While this will involve many different things, my attention for the Fall will be on two areas. The first and most prominent is cultivating our small group environments. Small group ministries are a great way to build community, and we are looking at the best way to do them here. Second, I am looking at our educational offerings, including exploring adding a new Sunday School option, hosting a mid-week Bible study later in the year, and offering a few "one-off" studies that will be more accessible for all of us who wish to plug into something, but are finding it difficult with increasingly busy schedules. Be on the lookout for information about these events in the coming weeks.

It's been great connecting with some of you, but I know there are many more. If you're inclined, please reach out and set up some time to meet. I'd love to hear about your experiences, ideas, and hopes for Steele Creek.

What we are talking about is things like:

- · An electrical outlet that doesn't work
- · A leaky faucet
- A commode that runs too much
- Changing filters in the a/c or furnace
- · Changing batteries in the smoke detectors
- Installing battery operated smoke detectors if you don't have them
- · Mounting a ceiling fan
