Margaret Woodside "Woody" Niell, 101, born in Charlotte, NC went to be with the Lord at Palmetto Patriots Home in Gaffney SC on September 1, 2024.

A Celebration of Life Service will be held at Steele Creek at Pleasant Hill Presbyterian Church, 15000 York Road, Charlotte, NC 28278, on Sunday, September 22 at 3:00 PM followed by a reception in the multipurpose room.

She was a member of Steele Creek at Pleasant Hill Church, where she served as Circle Chairman and as a volunteer with the Girl Scouts, on the bereavement committee, Visitation Committee, Ashe County Clothing Drive, Gleaners and with Loaves and Fishes. She also volunteered with Shepherd's Center and accompanied her husband on trips taking severely burned children to the Shriner's Hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio.

She was a graduate of Central High School in Charlotte and of the Presbyterian School of Nursing. She served as a Second Lieutenant in the Army Nursing Corps during World War II at Thayer Hospital in Nashville and Fort Bragg Hospital. She was a member of American Legion Post 221 where she met her husband of 65 years. In 1993 she was registered in the Women in Military Service by friends in the American Legion. After her military service, she worked at Presbyterian Hospital for over 30 years until her retirement as the 5th Floor Nursing Supervisor. She continued to care for others as a Hospice Volunteer.

She is survived by her children Jimmy Niell, Beth Niell Smith, (husband Chet); Grandchildren: Clay Niell, Jay Niell, (wife Katie), Cas Smith, Hiatt Smith Fields, (husband, Derek); Great Grandchildren: Charli and Addie Niell and Wyatt, EJ, Norah, Isaac and Marlee Smith. She was predeceased by her husband, James Warren Niell, parents, Moffatt and Grace Woodside, siblings Harvey Woodside, Kay Dowdell and John Woodside.

RECIPE

We haven't had a recipe in a while, and I would like to introduce you to one of my weird collections. I collect old cookery books. So, this unusual recipe is from Every-Day Cookery for Every Family by Mrs. Sarah E. Scott published in 1866.

Sweet Potato Coffee

A medium sized sweet potato is pared, and while in the raw state sliced. These slices are then cut crosswise, to the size and shape of dice. These are then roasted slowly over a fire, as one does coffee. The moisture off the potato gradually evaporates in about the same time coffee would roast. It grinds as easily as coffee, is as strong and dark, and only differs in taste by a slight resemblance to cocoa. It takes very little sugar, and is a substantial, cheap, and no doubt, healthy drink for breakfast.

Kairos Prison Ministry delivers homemade cookies to over 1,300 inmates, guards and staff to SC Department of Corrections at Kershaw, SC. Can you find some time to bake? Go ahead and start making the cookies and freeze them. If you don't have enough room in your home freezer, there is freezer space at the church. These cookies are so important to those that are incarcerated. Please pray over your cookies as a source of His love to shine on the prisoners and the staff. Pray that each cookie brings the inmate, officer or warden who eats one closer to God.

THE GUIDELINES THAT MUST BE FOLLOWED ARE FROM THE SOUTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS. DO NOT DEVIATE, OR THE COOKIES WILL NOT BE DELIVERED.

Cookie Guidelines

The types of cookies that are acceptable are:

Chocolate chip, sugar, ginger, molasses, oatmeal and peanut butter.

Cookies should be between TWO (2) and TWO AND ONE HALF (2.5) INCHES ACROSS and not more than half (0.5) inch thick.

DO NOT USE ICING, POWDERED SUGAR OR ANY OTHER TYPE OF COATING ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE COOKIE. DO NOT ADD ANY KIND OF FRUIT OR NUTS TO THE COOKIES.

IMPORTANT: Bag thoroughly cooled cookies in a clear QUART sized zip lock bag only. A dozen cookies to a bag. We cannot re-bag or hand-out in any other packaging.
