The work will involve cleanup of downed trees (chainsaw operators and limb-draggers) or mud-outs (stripping interiors of residences that have water damage). On Monday, October 14, 2024, a small group of our congregation went on a one day mission trip to the Asheville area to assist with the Baptists on Missions group.

Eleven people woke very early to meet at the church well before sunrise Monday morning to ride the bus together to Asheville, NC, joining up with the Baptists On Missions group, they provided assistance to two households.

The first was an elderly woman who had a tree fall on her house and crush her car. One of the large limbs from the tree came through her ceiling causing her to be displaced for the time being. Our group was able to cut off the limb, tarp the roof where needed and help the homeowner move her furniture from the affected

are of the house to another area of the house.

The crew continued their work outside with chainsaws and a lot of hands. Though the drive and yard were very steep, they were able to clear the yard and safely cut up trees as needed. Later, a crane will be needed to remove the trunk from the roof. Crew that went: 10 from the church, plus one from ATL (Dexter's Daughter).

The crew also helped a single mom of two school age children. She lost a willow tree, but fortunately it did not fall on her house or car. To serve her the crew cut the willow and stacked the wood neatly for her to use if she wants. This will most definitely help create a safer environment for her children to play. \square

Cancer Awareness Month

In October 2013, Steele Creek Presbyterian Church hosted its first annual Cancer Awareness Month service with a multidenominational worship service, guest speakers, special music and followed by a reception offering informational materials and experts ready to answer questions.

With the passing of Phyllis Osborne's sister-in-law from cancer a few months earlier in April, Pastor Jeff Pinkston agreed to Phyllis' request to do something special in honor of and in memory of those recovered from or taken by cancer. At that time, it was planned to become an annual event. So, each year Phyllis chooses an organization to support, and this year it is Ronald McDonald House Charities of Greater Charlotte.

The program may have morphed over time, but the intent is still there—to bring attention to the disease that touches so many of our lives.

To serve her the crew cut the willow and stacked the wood neatly for her to use if she wants. This will most definitely help create a safer environment for her children to play. \square
